


47th Avenue Bike Lane

Project Limits: Brighton to Clayton




47th Avenue Bike Lane

| Feedback theme | Response |

| Support in favor of bike lane | Feedback received |
| Concerns over parking loss | Design revised between Claude-Gaylord to allow for parking to remain this block |
| Sidewalk improvements needed | City and NDCC seeking funding for improvements |
| Bike lane on 48 th Ave instead | Bike lane on 48 th would not allow crossing of York |
| Better street lighting needed | More information needed |
| More bike parking needed | City working with property owners on bike parking opportunities |
| Parking needed in front of Ciancio's Liquors | Design revised between Claude-Gaylord to provide parking adjacent to Ciancio's |





Next Steps

| Anticipated Date | Action |
|-----------------------|--|
| Late October 2016 | Bike lane installation in short-term material |
| Spring or Summer 2017 | Repaving of E 47 th Ave (west of York) and bike lane installation in long-term material |


