NATIONAL WESTERN STOCK SHOW

- Denver County Fair is in full swing and we are signing new talent for the fair this year. The revival of Records is big this year and opening Friday night of fair is a Record sale and 80's Band revival! Beer and Wine fest will again be a big celebration on Saturday.
- Continue to work with design teams on planning for the buildings on site at NW Center.
- Our fundraising efforts are going very well, with pledge forms now signed at 22 million. Goal is 100 million.
- Stock Show is partnering with the PBR (Pro Bull Riders) association to broadcast our first 5 days of rodeo and PBR on Ridepass. We were the first rodeo in the country to be broadcast live on Ridepass with Rodeo All-Star Weekend this past April.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY

- Water in the West Symposium--April 26-27, CSU hosted the Water in the West Symposium, which sold out at 410 attendees. Speakers included Secretary of Ag Sonny Perdue, who sat down for a conversation with Tom Vilsack, former Secretary of Agriculture and advisor to CSU. We are already beginning to plan for next year.
- WRC Design—CSU received 17 responses to our RFQ and has shortlisted teams for interviews, which will happen at the end of June. Once design begins, we will circle back for design discussions with the CAC and community.
- Animal Health Building--The Program Plan for the Animal Health Building was approved by the CSU Board of Governors in early May.

HISTORY COLORADO\

- History Colorado's Curator of Artifacts, Alisa DiGiacomo, completed an oral interview withe Bettie Cram this month and is currently working to edit and prepare the interview for future use. Alisa learned a great deal from Bettie and was particularly intrigued by her early life on the Eastern Plains, information she had not found documented elsewhere.
- The Treaty of Guadalupe-Hildalgo that ended the Mexican War in 1848 and brought the land that is now Southern Colorado, Southern Utah, New Mexico, Arizona and California into the United States, is on display at History Colorado's El Pueblo Museum in Pueblo through July 4th. The treaty, normally held at the National Archives in Washington, DC, has never been shown in Colorado prior to this two month display.
