The event was well attended and followed by a community party along the corridor.</li> <li>The project team will continue work to finalize planters, cycle track and sidewalks. This work will take approximately three months; it will include intermittent lane closures but no complete street closures.</li> <li>Work will continue on the Segment 2 portion (40th – 44th Streets) on roadway construction (paving, curb &amp; gutter, sidewalks, streetside stormwater planters, cycle tracks, lighting and irrigation)</li> </ul>
Central 70 Reconstruction	Reconstruction of a 10-mile stretch of I-70 between Brighton Boulevard and Chambers Road.  More information: https://www.codot.gov/projects/i70east/projects/i70east/projects/i70east/traffic-impacts	CDOT continues preliminary work with geotechnical boring along the corridor; as well as survey work and soil testing in the Elyria Swansea area.  Light lane restrictions.  Mid-summer 2018: target timeframe for closure of 46th Ave. between Brighton Blvd. and York St. Final dates will be announced as soon as scheduled is finalized.
Central 70 Home Mitigations – Adelante Program	The CDOT Central 70 Project and the City of Denver have partnered to provide home improvements to those living closest to the I-70 viaduct- (up to 283 homes). The purpose of the Adelante Program is to reduce the impact of noise and dust during construction by providing improvements that help insulate homes.  The Program includes a package of improvements offered by CDOT (e.g. attic insulation, interior storm windows) and a separately funded list of items (e.g. new window and doors) provided by the City of Denver. Together, a total of nearly 1,200 improvements are being offered to participating homes.	<ul> <li>245 home assessments completed – 100% of homes that agreed to participate in the program</li> <li>96% of CDOT work completed or in progress</li> <li>61% of Denver work completed or in progress</li> <li>Energy Outreach Colorado (EOC), the primary contractor for the program, is moving forward to have the CDOT improvements completed before the start of active construction on Central 70</li> <li>City and County of Denver improvements will be completed by end of 2018</li> </ul>
