- CSU was proud to be involved with the National Western Stock Show for the 113th year!

- Contested Histories: Art and Artifacts from the Allen Hendershott Eaton Collection,"
 photographs, art and artifacts from wartime concentration camps many from Amache, the
 camp in southeast Colorado.
- Saturday, Feb. 16 7 pm: Satsuki Ina's first documentary "Children of the Camps," and a short feature, "Seppuku," by a young Japanese American filmmaker, Daryn Wakasa. Both films focus on the intergenerational transmission of trauma caused by the wartime incarceration. There will be a discussion with both filmmakers after the screening.
- Sunday, Feb. 17: Denver University's Archaeology Department professor Bonnie Clark will
 display artifacts from Colorado's concentration camp Amacheand share information about
 students' ongoing historical dig at the remote site in southeast Colorado.
