COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY

Project updates

- The three CSU System buildings are in the schematic design phase, with groundbreaking scheduled for early 2020.
- CSU System has hired AOR to brand the CSU Campus at the National Western Center.

Program/outreach updates

- Walter Robb, former Whole Foods co-CEO, will keynote the second annual CSU System <u>Water in</u> the West Symposium on Nov. 6-7 at the Gaylord Rockies.
- Kristin Kirkpatrick has been hired as the Executive Director of <u>Together We Grow</u>, which will have a permanent location in the CSU buildings at the National Western Center.
- On Sept. 24, the <u>Salazar Center for North American Conservation</u> (which will have a permanent location in the CSU buildings at the NWC) will host its inaugural international symposium on landscape connectivity in partnership with the Biennial of the Americas.
- Christie Vilsack, special advisor to the Chancellor, is managing CSU educational approach at the National Western Center, and will host a convening of formal and informal educators from around the state to identify priorities and next steps for K12 education initiatives.
- CSU 4-H programs are working to connect with current community after-school structures to offer programming to GES students.
- CSU is assisting with gardening coursework (outlines and teaching) as part of the Focus Points Family Resource Center Huerta 2-generational program.









- Little Shop of Physics will be at Bruce Randolph School for STEM outreach on November 21. This event is in partnership with surroundings elementary schools and students at BRS.
- CSU Bridge Scholars, Upward Bound students who are part of the Environmental Careers and Education Pathways program presented GES neighborhood benefit projects to Fort Collins and Denver audiences in July. They are hosting a River Festival on August 31st at Carpio-Sanguinetti Park.
- CSU will host the 7th annual <u>community animal health clinic</u> at Focus Points Family Resource Center on October 5, in partnership with Dumb Friends League. This event previews vet care that will be available at the CSU campus at the National Western Center.
- This Fall, CSU and History Colorado will work with Bruce Randolph School students to do a Youth Memory Project, financed through a NDCC grant.
- The Youth Action Coalition, an initiative to involve youth from the Globeville and Elyria-Swansea neighborhoods in the redevelopment of the National Western Center will launch in early 2020.
 Youth will be compensated for their time.
- The CSU team was at Latin Fest, Denver County Fair, Grow Haus Block Party, Clinica Adelante 5K, CSU River Fest.
