Why are we here?

Excise and Licenses, in partnership with NWCO, is requesting an ordinance change that creates regulations around alcohol consumption at the National Western Center.



How did we get here?

SB 19-200:

- Signed into law on May 28, 2019
- Expands ability for patrons of National Western Center to consume alcohol beverages
- Requires the City and County of Denver to pass an ordinance to effectuate expanded consumption, including identifying when and where it is allowed.



What does state law permit or prohibit?

When and where authorized by local ordinance, Patrons of National Western Center are permitted to:


- Remove alcohol beverages from the licensed premises of the liquor-licensed establishment where it was purchased
- Consume the beverage in approved areas of the National Western Center called alcohol consumption areas or on other liquor-licensed premises within the National Western Center

Patrons of National Western Center are NOT permitted to:

- Bring outside alcohol beverages into the National Western Center
- Remove alcohol beverages from the National Western Center








NWC SITE PLAN

Overview of Ordinance Requirements

Approval Required

Approval must be obtained prior to the operation of an alcohol consumption area, per event.

Approval process starts with an application to EXL

EXL Director approves alcohol consumption areas by order

Application

Site plan with boundaries of consumption area

Proof of ownership or possession

Proposed date(s) and hours of event

Security plan to ensure compliance with liquor laws

Causes for Denial

Proposed consumption area doesn't have adequate security

Proposed consumption area doesn't have adequate barriers

Approval would adversely impact health, safety, or welfare

Applicant has previously been denied

Disciplinary Actions

Approval may be suspended or revoked

Reasons for discipline include those in Chapter 32 and Causes for Denial

Unlawful Acts

Outside alcohol brought into alcohol consumption areas

Removal of alcohol beverages from alcohol consumption areas

Consumption of alcohol outside of state permitted hours

Violation of state laws/rules or rules adopted by EXL Director

- Notice of EXL rulemaking

EXL rulemaking hearing and rules adopted
