NATIONAL WESTERN STOCK SHOW

- Our complex is now able to go to full capacity and as such, many more events are being booked including concerts, horse shows and expo hall exhibits. Go to National Western Complex webpage for all the information.
- Stock show planning is in full swing, and we just received 3.5 million dollars from the legislature for operations support to help us through the pandemic. The money will be used to bring back employees and bridge the gap between now and our January show.
- Capital campaign fundraising stands at 80 million in pledges to date and we are making many presentations face to face now that we are able to present in person.

NATIONAL WESTERN AUTHORITY

- **SYEC activation.** The Authority will be operating the Stockyards Event Center by late fall and is focused on events activation for the new building as well as events in the Yards.
- Hiring. The Authority will be hiring two new positions: a Facilities Engineer and an
 Events Operations Manager. Those position descriptions are being developed now. The
 Facilities Engineer position will be posted in the next 60 days, the timing for the Events
 Ops Manager will follow that.
- **Pursuing bond projects**. We are partnering with NWCO to request that the future Arena and the future public market be included in the November GO Bond. CSU and WSSA are lending their support to the request.
- The National Western Center Authority Board of Directors has an opening for a resident of Globeville or Elyria-Swansea (GES), to be appointed by Denver Mayor Michael B. Hancock. The new board member will serve as a link to the community, reflecting its

voice in pursuit of the center's mission and guiding principles. The 13-member board of directors oversees the National Western Center's work programming, operating, maintaining and promoting the campus — work that is already well underway. The full board generally meets on the third Thursday of the month at 9 a.m. The new board member would likely join the Community Benefits Committee of the board, which also meets monthly.
