COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY

- The last beam was placed on the Spur Hydro building on Thursday, September 16th. You can continue to watch the construction progress and take a tour on our website.
- Save the date! CSU, Dumb Friends League, and Focus Points will host their annual free Pet Vaccine Clinic on Saturday, October 2 at the Swansea Recreation Center from 9-3 p.m.
- CSU Extension, in partnership with Focus Points is offering a free six-week
 course, <u>Éxito Educativo</u> starting October 6th. This exciting after-school program
 brings Latino parents and their students in high school together to learn about the
 requirements for high school graduation, the different sources of support, and the
 pathways to college.
- CSU hosted the third annual BioBlitz pro to collect ecological data along the South Platte River on September 23-24. Thank you to our partners Denver Zoo, Denver Botanic Gardens, and others for participating in this event.
- CSU Spur Service Days have allowed staff and partners to get into the local community in a meaningful way: in July, the group removed 700 pounds of trash from the trails around the South Platte River; in August, the team partnered with Extreme Community Makeover and worked alongside two homeowners to repair their homes and cleaned two alleyways; November will bring a food drive and volunteer food distribution day with the local community center.
- CSU Spur and CSU Fort Collins are partnering with the Denver Museum of Nature and Science's Institute of Science and Policy to create a series of <u>free</u> webinars and IMAX screenings related to food and agriculture.

- Kathryn Venzor, Spur Education Director, has hired Adrienne Sedlak as Spur Education Coordinator. Additional education staff and a volunteer corps will be brought on to support educational programs at Spur.
- Five students accepted a \$10,000 <u>CSU Spur Scholarship</u> this fall (awarded as \$2,500/year) to attend CSU Fort Collins the students are studying business administration, construction management, psychology, and civil engineering.
- The Spur Scholarship is a need-based scholarship for incoming first-year students from the 80216-zip code to attend any of the CSU System institutions: CSU Fort Collins, CSU Pueblo, CSU Global.
 - The CSU System has partnered with Bruce Randolph School for the past five years, and the partnership continues to grow. Denver Public Schools and CSUS worked together to envision an AgConnect (Ag Tech) pathway

- program, which enrolled 60 students in its first year at Bruce Randolph School.
- CSUS worked with BRS to bring a Big Green garden to the school; the school will also build an indoor hydroponic garden and outdoor greenhouse by summer 2022.
- CSU Fort Collins is offering Horticulture 100 as an Extended Campus dual enrollment course in alignment with the pathway program -- 36 students are enrolled in the dual enrollment course.
