NATIONAL WESTERN STOCK SHOW

- NWSS is seeking emergency funding from the state legislature with HB1262. We received an 11-0 vote in the Agriculture Committee and has moved on through the Appropriations committee. This will allow us the rehire staff that have been laid off and prepare for the 2022 show.
- The complex is booked heavily in the fall, as the promoters are assuming no more masks, or social distancing will be in place. We hope that becomes a reality.
- We continue to fight OK City for cattle exhibitors. Some feel Colorado is negative towards agriculture. We will continue to compete as we near January.

NATIONAL WESTERN AUTHORITY

- Authority Board update. We are grateful to Gabby Acevedo of Elyria-Swansea, who has served as a member of the National Western Center Authority Board of Directors for about a year. Gabby resigned from the board this month due to new career commitments. Gabby is one of two GES residents appointed to the board by Mayor Hancock, and we will work with the mayor's office on the process to replace Gabby on the board with a resident from GES.
- New Agrarian Program. The National Western Center has joined with the Santa-Febased Quivira Coalition to expand Quivira's "New Agrarian Program" in Colorado. In this apprenticeship program, skilled ranchers and farmers across the West partner with Quivira to host annual apprenticeships in regenerative agriculture. This year, the
