- **Community Investment Fund exploration.** Councilwomen CdeBaca and Ortega have appointed and convened a group of GES residents to explore possibilities for the National Western Center's future Community Investment Fund, including oversight and structure for the fund. The group has met once, in April, and will continue to meet regularly.
- **Handover:** The Maintenance and Operations building and grounds were officially handed over to the Authority on April 21st for its governance and control.
- **M&O Lease.** The Authority and WSSA have executed a lease for WSSA's occupancy of the Maintenance and Operations space. The Authority reserved space within the building for its growing owner's stock and equipment. **Urban Land Institute conference**.

The National Western Center will be featured in multiple presentations at the Urban Land Institute's national conference on May 20. It will be featured in the context of sustainability, as well as redevelopment and reuse, and municipal infrastructure.

- **East Denver Food Hub**. Authority staff toured the East Denver Food Hub, which provides farm-fresh food for the community and promotes equity and inclusion in our local food system.
- **D9 Food Desert Solutions**. Authority staff has joined the District 9 Food Desert Solution Advisory Committee, led by Councilwoman CdeBaca.
